Association among Death Anxiety, Quality of Life and Spirituality in Hemodialysis Patients; Systematic Review

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Abstract

Hemodialysis defined as the effective procedure dealing with renal failure patients. It helps patients to function properly which ultimately enhances their life-span. The review is done with purpose to illustrate the impact of hemodialysis on patient's quality of life and death anxiety and how spirituality deals with that. The review explored the association among death anxiety, quality of life and spirituality in hemodialysis patients. For this, 141 articles were examined initially and then finally 19 articles were finalized. The review included studies from 2013 to Sep 2023. The review comprised one qualitative and 18 quantitative studies. The review extracted four theme (i) spirituality the main factor associated with death anxiety (ii) dialysis patients experienced anxiety (iii) spirituality lessens death anxiety and improves quality of life (iv) kidney disease leads to death anxiety. The review claimed that spirituality showers positive influence on patient's psychological health. It specified that enhancing spiritual based programs in hospitals and promoting spiritual knowledge to patient lessens their death related anxiety and enhances quality of life.

Introduction

Hemodialysis is an effective treatment procedure for the patients living with renal failure. When the kidney stops working naturally, the procedure of hemodialysis helps the kidney to function properly and to enhance the life span of patient. But the procedure demands the visit to hospital twice or thrice a week, which completely affects their life. Hemodialysis patients experiences many changes in life such as physical deteriorations, fatigue, increased risk of heart disease, financial disturbances and psychological problems such as anxiety and depression which directly affects their quality of life (Ghiasi et al., 2021). As other chronic patients,

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hemodialysis patients also experience stress and depression but by using different coping strategies and promoting spiritual awareness can help the patient to better understand the reality which improves their quality of life. The study reveals that death anxiety because of dialysis affects quality of life, but can be reduced by spirituality (Taghipour et al., 2017).

Studies published in International journals from Pakistan reveals that renal failure is caused by diabetes mellitus 33%, hypertension 12% and kidney stones 7% approximately (Mahmud et al., 2014).

Anees et al., (2008) conducted research on dialysis patients and reported that depression in patients undergoing dialysis affects their mortality and also affects quality of life. The study reported that 10% to 66% of dialysis patients are under depression. The study also reported factors associated with depression were marital status, socio-economic status, financial support, and number of family members, hypertension and illiteracy (Solomon et al., 2022). The study concluded that depression can cause many other issues such as gastro-intestinal issues, sleep disturbance and loss of appetite. Study findings also revealed that depression can be lessen by enhancing quality of life. Study suggested that dialysis treatment should must add psychological help in treatment procedures.

Mahmud et al., (2014) reported in their study that renal failure is a chronic illness what result in high cost of treatment with fear of death and poor life quality. The study reported that from 189 patients of renal disease 87 patients were diabetic, which means diabetes is a cause for renal failure. They also described in their study, majority patients were not aware from their disease and not receiving treatment because of improper health related facilities or poverty. The study concluded that diabetes and hypertension are common leading causes for renal failure.

Anees et al., (2014) worked on evaluating demographic factors which affect quality of life in hemodialysis patients and explained quality of life as individual's own perception regarding their life including their expectations and cultural and social concerns. They concluded that hemoglobin level, literacy, sex, nutritional status, socio-economic status, comorbidities such as cardiovascular issues, hypertension, diabetes, and hepatitis had a great impact on patient's quality of life. Dialysis patients faced various adverse effects such as a major change in diet, body image, mental fatigue, dependency on machines caused an increase in patient's quality of life. The study also described patient's financial status had a great impact on quality of life in hemodialysis patients. Income has a positive impact on patient's satisfaction with life. The study concluded that patients having good source of income have less financial stress and good quality of life.

METHODOLOGY

Material

For the systematic review, initially 141 articles were searched. After collecting and screening the articles duplicate articles were removed. After the retrieving of irrelevant articles 19 articles were elected considering most relevant for examining the association among death anxiety, quality of life and spirituality in hemodialysis patients. The literature for the review was included from 2013 to Sep 2023.

Criteria for Selection

The criteria of choosing the relevant studies for review was hemodialysis studies specifically discussed death anxiety, quality of life and spirituality in patients undergoing hemodialysis.

Inclusion Criteria

The criteria was made for studies included in the review, only those researches were incorporated which worked on hemodialysis patients in context with death anxiety, quality of life and spirituality.

Exclusion Criteria

Studies which have discussed other type of dialysis such as peritoneal dialysis were excluded. Studies which have focused on death anxiety due to some other reason rather dialyses were excluded. Studies which have focused on some other construct which reduces death anxiety and enhances quality of life were also excluded from the review. Studies before the year of 2013 were also excluded.

Search Strategy

The literature for review was extracted from Google, Google scholar, PsycInfo, ScienceDirect, research gate and PubMed.


Search Terms

The terms which have been used for searching the data for review were death anxiety and hemodialysis, spirituality and hemodialysis, quality of life and hemodialysis, death anxiety + quality of life among hemodialysis patients, death anxiety and spirituality among hemodialysis patients, spirituality enhances quality of life among hemodialysis patients.

Process of Study Selection

For the review selection process, firstly titles and abstracts of the studies were reviewed many times on screen very carefully. Secondly, before selecting studies for review it was decided that the search studies will be considered only if they met the inclusion criteria, all the other searched studies would be excluded from the review. After selecting final studies, all of the final studies were reviewed again to add in systematic review.

Quality of Included Studies

The quality of included studies and its usefulness was evaluated. Quality of the studies considered for the review was they discussed hemodialysis patients specifically with related to experiences of death anxiety, spirituality and quality of life. The population in all studies was hemodialysis patients, purpose of the research, result and conclusion of studies was reported.

Data Extraction

The form of data extraction was designed to add the essential information which was discussed in earlier studies such as purpose of study, design/plot of study, population, main findings and conclusion (Table 1).

RESULTS AND DISCUSSION

Characteristics of the study

The systematic review has done on hemodialysis patients in-context with death anxiety, quality of life and spirituality. Dialysis is actually the treatment for kidney to work properly when the kidney stopped functioning naturally. Dialysis treatment has so many side effects on patient's mental and physical health as well as it affects financial status. The review concluded four themes: spirituality is the main factor associated with death anxiety, dialysis patients experienced anxiety, spirituality lessens death anxiety and improves quality of life, kidney disease leads to death anxiety.

Qualitative Studies

The review incorporated only one qualitative study which discovered that kidney disease patients suffered a lot from anxiety after hearing their disease.

Quantitative Studies

The current review comprised 18 quantitative studies focused on psychological problems arise after being kidney patient/hemodialysis patient. Hemodialysis is the very common procedure of kidney failure. The review studies revealed that hemodialysis patients suffered a lot from psychological problems.

1- Spirituality is the main factor associated with death anxiety

The review has been done on spirituality, death anxiety, quality of life. The review concluded that spirituality had a great impact on psychological heath of a kidney disease patient. Kidney disease patients who are more spiritual suffers less with death anxiety. They actually believe on the Almighty, believes that this

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is by GOD. And He will definitely heal their problem. They also believes that being more spiritual and being more close to Almighty their problem will go soon. Taghipour et al., (2017) conducted a research and illustrated that by enhancing spirituality death anxiety of a kidney patient can be minimized.

2- Dialysis patients experienced anxiety

Studies revealed that patients undergoing dialysis suffers a lot with anxiety. When they underwent a dialysis they got anxious toward their physical health, family burden, financial issues and so on.

3- Spirituality lessens death anxiety and improves quality of life

Studies exposed that spirituality reduces death anxiety and maintains quality of life of a kidney patient makes the better life for her/him. Spirituality makes them feel relax emotionally. Davison and Jhangri (2013) conducted and concluded that spirituality plays a vital role in a patient's life. Taghiabadi, (2017) illustrated in a study that patient with poor mental health have lower level of spiritual wellbeing. Spiritual experiences also minimize anxiety and stressors. Fradelos et al., (2021) pinpointed that spirituality have significant positive effect on a patient's quality of life.

4- Kidney disease leads to death anxiety

A qualitative study conducted and highlighted that patients with kidney disease leads to higher level of death anxiety. They assume that by being a patient of kidney disease they will die soon and this destroys their mental state (Thejavathi & Talwar, 2023).

The review was conducted on death anxiety, spirituality and quality of life among patients undergoing dialysis. The review basically focused on treatment outcomes influenced psychological health of a patient such as death anxiety and quality of life affected by dialysis. The review focused on both qualitative and quantitative studies.

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Specifically, the current review emphasized on spirituality; believing that being more spiritual death related anxiety can be lessened and quality of life can be enhanced. The review has four major themes. Ashwandi et al., (2018) worked on hemodialysis patients and concluded that promoting spiritual care related programs can lessen the death anxiety among hemodialysis patients. Hosseni et al., (2022) also worked on shia-Muslim hemodialysis patients and pinpointed that spiritual-oriented programs minimizes fear of death in hemodialysis patients.

CONCLUSION

The current review was intended to highlight the effect of spirituality among hemodialysis patients. For this purpose, the study explored the influence of spirituality on death related and patient's quality of life. The study pinpointed four major themes (i) Spirituality is the main factor associated with death anxiety, (ii) Dialysis patients experienced anxiety, (iii) Spirituality lessens death anxiety and improves quality of life, (iv) Kidney disease leads to death anxiety. The review claimed that spirituality has a positive impact on patient's psychological health. It stated that enhancing spiritual programs in hospitals and promoting spiritual knowledge to patient minimizes their death related anxiety and maximizes quality of life.

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
